# **Police Report**

- Local crime statistics 55 Crimes 29 solved (52.7%) YTD 231, 88 Solved (38.1%)
- Police Surgery Vehicle –mobile surgery vehicle will be brought (when available) to East Main Street (coinciding with monthly meetings).
- Parked Cars on pavements creating access problems for individuals using guide dogs and pedestrians
  with push chairs to be addressed directly to individual concerned but police involvement is available if
  required

# Waste Management Planning application East Mains Ind. Est.

- Mark Leatherland Wm Tracy Group currently operating in industrial estate and are planning a 'land swap' with Broxburn Bottlers necessitating a 'change of use' application
- Non hazardous /inert waste- cardboard, building waste, metal timber glass no increase in tonnage
  processed, Site owner duty bound to ensure that material is screened to ensure no asbestos or other
  hazardous materials are brought to site (enforced by SEPA). Material stored until full loads accumulated,
  Damping for external materials to prevent dust
- Nearest housing to new site Hill view approximately 100m
- Vehicle frequency 24 vehicles per 12 hours period non linear, peaking at 4-5 in any one hour
- Operating hours 7am 7pm Mon Fri , 7am 1pm Sat, No activity on Sundays
- Site visit Broxburn Community Council requested a site visit to view operation. Agreed TBA

# **Tesco Planning Application**

- Ben Train / Kirsty Leiper presentation covered the following topics
- Need for store? addressing 'expenditure leakage' to neighboring supermarkets in Livingston Bathgate
- Employment opportunities 271 jobs, focus on employing local, and long term unemployed
- Store size 30,000 ft2 (approx half size of Bathgate Tesco) estimated spend £3-400k per week
- Store construction timber construction, timber cladding, carbon neutral
- **Impact on main street** 'retention of shoppers within Broxburn will assist main street retailers and will bring additional spend into the town
- **Delivery times** permitted delivery times are governed by council, (6-7 deliveries per day), routes can be provided by Tesco Distribution to avoid hot spots, controlled by vehicle GPS- monitored by Tesco Logistics

## Concerns from residents -

- Proximity of petrol station to housing increase traffic levels created by presence of store and opening route
  to Greendykes Road via Clarkston Road which is route to school for local children route to store by delivery
  drivers clearing of site contamination supermarket trolleys in canal Winchburgh residents who currently
  use Broxburn main Street are likely to stop at Tesco saturation if additional supermarkets also succeed
- Feedback from community council 'opinion poll' on Tesco
- Broxburn Community Council carried out a poll of local residents during and after the Tesco public presentation. The results were as follows

Total Responses 222 In favour 124 ( 56%) Opposed 98 ( 44%)

# **Multiple Supermarket Applications**

- Sainsbury, Tesco, (3<sup>rd</sup> Applicant at Thistle Industrial Estate) due to the multiple applications for supermarket provision in the Broxburn locality it is likely that this shall be discussed at a special Full WLC meeting (as per Armadale)
- **Public meeting** possibility of a local public meeting to be held to allow the wider community to express their views ie which applicant offers the best option for the town and surrounding area
